Hello Marilyn,

I hope all is going well at Stanbridge. Alex(andra) is still going to West Valley Community College and is adapting as one would expect for a person with Asperger's Syndrome. To help with her achieve success, which includes both organizational and subject matter understanding, we have enlisted the aid of a professional tutor with solid credentials in math, science, romance languages and the liberal arts. Her name is Alexandra Ranker, and I would like to introduce her to you as a potential resource to the parents of the students at Stanbridge, both current and past.

Ms. Ranker's academic background includes a B. A. in English Literature with minors in Classics and Psychology (Magna Cum Laude) from the University of Washington, Seattle, and Graduate Studies in Education at San Francisco State University. Her math skills derive from three years at UW as a chemical engineering major. She has used this to tutor students in math, science, Spanish, Latin and social sciences at both high school and college levels. Ms. Ranker has a website at www.rankertutor.com which you can visit at your convenience.

She has worked with learning disabled students with ADHD and Asperger's Syndrome. Our particular interest for Alex started with tutoring in College Algebra and Statistics, which has always been a particular challenge for her. Unfortunately, we brought Ms. Ranker in after about 6 weeks of classes had already passed, and Alex was too far behind at that point to recover and she had to drop the class. The shortfall in Math impacted her other subjects which were also had fallen behind. We had Ms. Ranker focus on helping Alex catch up in the other subjects and become more organized. Alex finished her semester with an A and a B in remaining subjects. We would have been happy with "C's", as we afraid that the semester would end with failure for her and a big hit to her confidence.

This semester Ms. Ranker is focusing on teaching Alex how to organize her 3 classes (English, Communications, and Art) and acquiring college level study habits. Again, we are concerned with Alex becoming "standalone" and "self-advocating" at college, and would be satisfied with "C's" if she can do this mostly on her own. As you know, this may take another semester or two for her to nail down what she must do on a daily basis (both studying and planning).

Because of Ms. Ranker's good work with Alex, I would like to introduce her to you as a potential resource for the parents at Stanbridge, again both current and past. She will be contacting you soon to introduce herself personally and ask you for a brief meeting at your convenience.
